

Where are the best beaches in Southern California?

Laguna Beach, without a doubt! There are many beautiful public beaches in Laguna Beach. Picnic Beach has a paved walkway down to the sand for the guests, and public restrooms. Diver's Cove has concrete steps down to the beach and also has public restrooms. Both these beaches are in Heisler Park so up on the cliff are beautiful gardens, palm trees, rock benches, beautiful places to take pictures. Shaw's Cove, Woods cove, Moss Street/Point and Treasure Island are Very beautiful and more secluded. Tides must be taken into consideration when deciding which beach would be best.

The Laguna Beach locations require permits/reservations. For more information you can call 949-497-0352. Laguna Beach Locations are \$175, 949-497-0716 to reserve.

However, if you are having fewer than 10 people a permit might not be warranted if you have your ceremony at Shaw's Cove, Woods Cove or Moss Street/Point
